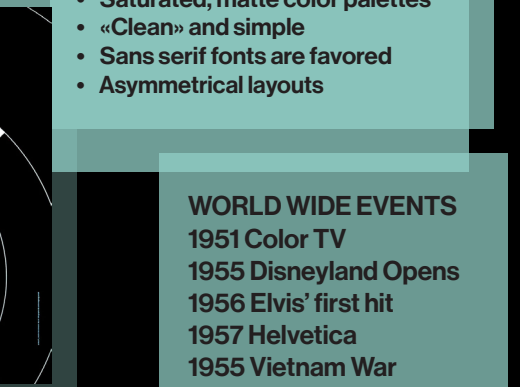
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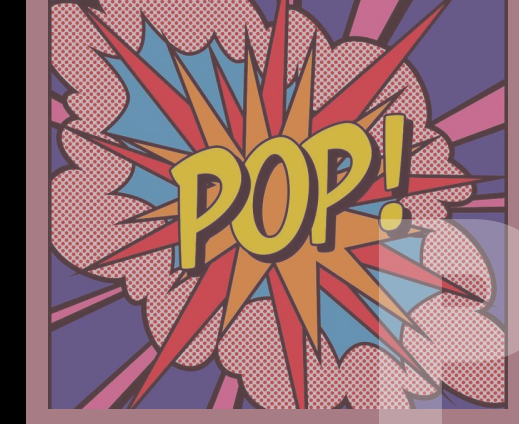
# SWISS STYLE

The International Typographic Style, also known as the Swiss Style, is developed by designers in Switzerland during the 1950s. The style required a clean design space, with a lot of negative space given among the elements:

- Consistent use of negativ space
- Saturated, matte color palettes
- «Clean» and simple
- Sans serif fonts are favored
- Asymmetrical layouts

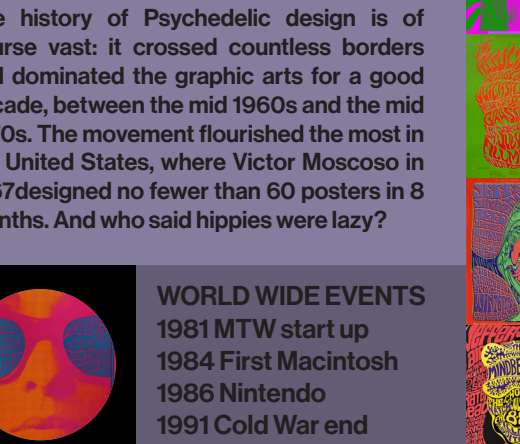


Pop Art was created by the New York artists of the early 1960s such as Andy Warhol and Roy Lichtenstein. Pop Artists used familiar objects from popular culture as antithesis of traditional "high art" to protest against traditional themes of morality, religion, and history.

The history of Psychedelic design is of course vast: it crossed countless borders and dominated the graphic arts for a good decade, between the mid 1960s and the mid 1970s. The movement flourished the most in the United States, where Victor Moscoso in 1967 designed no fewer than 60 posters in 8 months. And who said hippies were lazy?

## NEW WAVE PUNK

In design, New Wave or Punk refers to an approach to typography that defies strict grid-based arrangement conventions. Characteristics include inconsistent letter-spacing, varying typeweights within single words and type set at non-right angles.

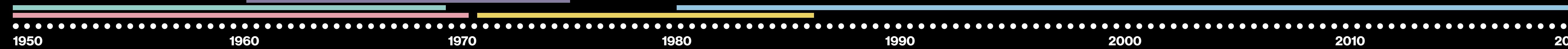

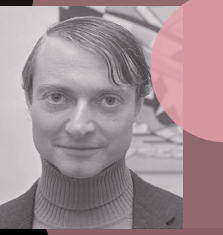
